

Volunteer Core Leader Application

Introduction

Thank you for your interest in California State Parks Foundation's volunteer program! Since 2010, our year-round volunteer program has provided meaningful volunteer opportunities for Californians to help their state parks. Currently, we plan more than 100 volunteer workdays a year across California. These workdays are led by Volunteer Core Leader teams.

Requirements

- Participate in three California State Parks Foundation volunteer workdays.
- Complete a background check paid for by California State Parks Foundation.
- Attend mandatory trainings, that includes:
 - New Volunteer Core Leader Training (virtual)
 - "Co-creating a Culture of Belonging" video recording
 - Submit a survey following completion
 - Annual all Volunteer Core Leader meeting (virtual)
- Join regional check-in meetings as needed (virtual or in person)
- Work with a team of core leaders (2-4 per park)
- Lead a minimum of 2 volunteer workdays a year.

Volunteer Core Leader Overview

Our program is volunteer led and volunteer managed. This volunteer dedication enables the program to expand its reach and support more parks across the state. Volunteer Core Leaders develop a rapport with park staff, get to know the unique culture and needs of their parks, and lead volunteer workdays. Each park will have more than one Volunteer Core Leader.

Volunteer Core Leader teams work together to share the roles and responsibilities required to host a workday. Leads will work closely with California State Parks Foundation staff to accomplish key projects and achieve quality volunteer experience.

Becoming a Volunteer Core Leader is a great fit for you if you are:

- Passionate about state parks and want to play a deeper role in getting good work done.
- A flexible team player and are comfortable working with people of all backgrounds.
- Interested in being part of a community of people that care deeply about state parks.
- Available to volunteer approximately once per month.

While not a requirement, we are also looking for Volunteer Core Leaders who:

- Speak multiple languages.
- Have deep ties in their local community.

- Have an interest in community outreach and promoting workdays.
- Have strong knowledge or an interest in learning about California native plants, habitat restoration, trail work, and/or general park maintenance projects.

Supply purchase: (work within budget to purchase supplies for event, submit receipts and reimbursement form to get reimbursed after event)

Photography: taking photos at workdays and uploading them to our Flickr site

Workday follow-up: submitting waivers, roster, completing the post-workday event report

Event promotion (using our flyer template to outreach in the local community)
